Examination of International Graduate Students Policy

Eligible international LLM and MJ students may be granted additional time to take an exam. An additional half-hour will be granted for a one-hour exam; an additional hour will be granted for any exams two or more hours. This policy applies only to exams given in school. No additional time will be granted for take-home exams or papers. During exams, international students may use *Black's Law Dictionary* and a foreign language/English dictionary.

All international LLM and MJ students are eligible to receive additional time on exams, with the following exceptions:

1. International students whose native language is English;
2. International students who come from a country where English is the official language;
3. International students who have done at least one year of study in English at the university or post-graduate level prior to entering John Marshall;

International JD students and international joint JD/LLM students are not eligible to receive extra time on exams.

When appropriate, directors of programs and the Associate Dean for Graduate Programs & Centers have the discretion to provide extra time to international graduate and non-degree students whose individual circumstances warrant receiving additional time on exams.

At the beginning of each semester, the Director of Admissions will prepare, in consultation with program directors and the Director of International Programs, a list of eligible international students and will forward this list to the Academic Services Office.
