Requirements to Earn the MJ Degree for Students Entering In or After Fall 2019

Graduation Requirements for MJ Students: To earn the Master of Jurisprudence (MJ) degree and be issued a diploma from UIC John Marshall Law School, a student must:

1. Successfully complete at least 30 credit hours of course work;
2. Satisfy all aspects of the required curriculum in place when the student matriculated;
3. Achieve a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5;
4. Absent extraordinary circumstances as determined by the Dean, not have a pending code of conduct case, Title IX investigation, or criminal case;
5. Absent extraordinary circumstances as determined by the Dean, not have an unresolved admissions application amendment;
6. Complete the course of study no later than 60 months after commencing study toward the degree, or within such other period as may be permitted under the "Time Limits for Degree Completion" policy;
7. Complete an exit interview with the Financial Aid Office, if the student has borrowed any federal loans; and
8. Absent extraordinary circumstances as determined by the Dean, not have an outstanding financial balance at the Law School.

Faculty policy approved October 1, 2018; effective for the Fall 2019 semester.
